AIR CHARTER SERVICE REPORTS A 75% INCREASE IN ENQUIRIES YEAR-ON-YEAR SINCE 1 MAY 2020. THE MOST POPULAR DESTINATIONS FOR POST-PANDEMIC TRIPS

Where to stay: Luxury wellness retreat, [Quinta da Comporta](#) set on the laid-back white sand beaches of Comporta and just an hour away from Lisbon, is open and ready for guests. Just a few minutes from the beach, the retreat offers mind, body and soul experiences and is themed around nearby rice fields with neutral tones and grain infused spa treatments. Double rooms start from £225 per night.

How to get there: Air Charter Service offers private flights from London to Lisbon (Portugal) from EUR 4,667 per person (£4,220) on a Phenom 300 Light Jet 6-seater jet for a 4-night stay (price based on full aircraft charter for a group of 6). Flight time two hours and 20 minutes.

4. ITALY

On 3 June, Italy opened up to international visitors with no quarantine in place, much to the delight of European travellers drawn by the vibrant culture, delicious food, and scenic Italian Riviera.



Where to stay: Brand new boutique hotel [Paragon 700](#) in Puglia opened its doors to guests for the first time on 18 June. The restored red palace in the heart of Puglia's White City, Ostuni, has just 11 individually curated rooms. A double room starts from £271 on a bed & breakfast basis. Exclusive buyouts are also available.

How to get there: Air Charter Service offers private flights from London to Brindisi (Italy) from EUR 5,166 per person (£4,674) on a Phenom 300 Light Jet 6-seater jet for a 4-night stay (price based on full aircraft charter for a group of 6). Flight time two hours and 45 minutes.
